

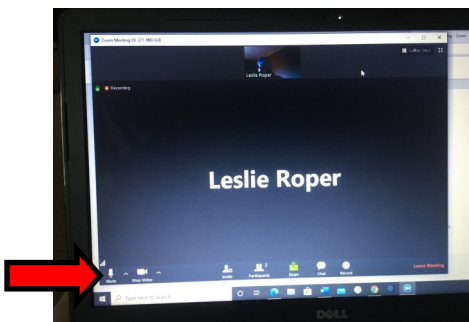
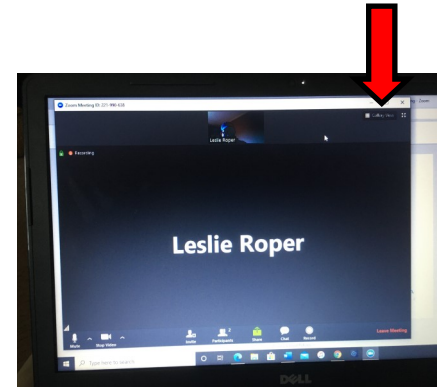
Logging on to Zoom through your computer

You will click on the meeting link (<https://us04web.zoom.us/j/913835039>) Sunday morning.

The first time you do it, it may ask you to download a plug-in. I would suggest logging on around 10:45 Sunday morning so that you have time to get everything figured out. When you join the meeting, click on “Join with Computer Audio”.

At the upper right corner of your screen, you can click to choose between “Gallery View” or “Speaker View”.

Gallery view will make a grid of the people on the call, kind of like the Brady Bunch theme song. Speaker view will put the screen of the active microphone in the largest portion of the screen. For worship, I suggest using “Speaker View”, so that you can follow along with what is happening.



During worship, I also ask that everyone “mutes” their own microphones. On the computer, the mute option is at the bottom left hand corner of your screen. The microphone will be red when you are muted.

After worship, I suggest everyone turns to “Gallery View”, which will allow you to see all of the beautiful faces of the other people who have called in for worship. I also suggest that everyone unmuters their microphone during this fellowship time so that you can talk to one another.

The other feature you should know about is the “chat” option. If you click on the “Chat” icon at the bottom of the screen (it looks like a cartoon voice bubble), a chat window will open up on the right of your screen. You can still see what is going on, but can type messages that everyone on the chat will be able to read. The chat function is much easier to use on a computer!!
